Easter Season Liturgical Changes

As with Christmas, Easter is not just a single day in the Episcopal Church. It is a season. We mark the changing season with intentional changes to the liturgy.

The most obvious change is the shift to Rite II and Prayer B.

Alleluia:

Since Ash Wednesday, the Alleluias have been omitted from our liturgies. "Alleluia" is the Latin form of the "ancient [Hebrew] praise-shout 'Hallelujah,' which means, "Praise the Lord," which in the Western Church became a "characteristic expression of joy." We welcome back the "Alleluias" on Easter Day.



The Paschal Candle:

The Paschal or Easter Candle is a candle of large size which represents Christ's person and whose flame symbolizes Christ's Resurrection as "the light of the world." Placed in a candle stand on the liturgical north side of the church, it is a dramatic symbol of Easter. In medieval times, the Paschal Candle often reached a stupendous size – the Paschal candle of Salisbury Cathedral was said to be 36 feet tall. When lit from the New Fire on Easter Eve, the candle is brought into the darkened church, representing Christ's tomb. The Deacon chants the Exultet, a hymn of joy and exultation, and other candles are lit from the Paschal Candle spreading the light through the Church. This dramatic ritual of the fire service dates back at least as far as the 4th century A.D.

Confession and Absolution:

You may notice that the Confession and Absolution are omitted on Easter Day and throughout the season. This is because the entire Easter Liturgy is Confession of God's redeeming work which frees us from our sin. On this day, we especially rejoice.

Standing:

From earliest Christian times, standing with arms outstretched, was the normal posture of prayer. Eucharistic Prayer B tells us why: "In [Christ] you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you." Standing in a posture of surrender is a symbol of our new life in Christ and of our status as God's beloved children--"fellow heirs with Christ." That's why the Council of Nicea (325 A.D.) forbade kneeling during the "Great 50 Days" of Easter, Easter Day to Pentecost. It is most appropriate to stand, especially during the Eucharistic Prayers, throughout the entire Easter Season.
