

Great news, Trinity!

As the Omicron variant wave peaked a few weeks back, the positive test rate numbers continue to fall to an acceptable level which enables us to return to church in person.



We will be re-opening in-person worship on **February 27th for the 10:15am service**.

We pray and hope that we can continue to stay open. Here are factors in our favor:

- 1. Positive test rate under 10%
- 2. Omicron infection is like a mild cold in the vaccinated.
- 3. Masks will continue to be worn in church due to singing
- 4. Our church space will be sanitized before every service
- 5. Hand sanitizer is available
- 6. Bread-only communion for the time being
- 7. Downstairs stream for those who want to be socially distanced
- 8. Better weather is imminent and inevitable!

As you know, we are a church in transition. So, while we complete that

process, I want to thank our regular 8 o'clockers for all of the patience they have displayed. We would like to have Rev. Bob start at Trinity and most importantly, get settled in the area, which will take us two or three weeks into March after which time we can reinstate the 8am service, assuming we are still on a path too seeing Covid off!

Outreach Focus: FACES

This month, the Outreach Committee highlights FACES. **Family and Community Empowerment Services** (FACES) is a nonprofit that many of you are familiar with. Trinity has a years-long tradition of supporting them with both volunteers and financial assistance.



Since 1964, FACES has provided emergency financial assistance, information, and referrals for families in

the communities of Fuquay-Varina and Willow Spring experiencing crisis situations related to shelter, utilities, and other basic human needs.

Today, FACES helps more people who have lost jobs and simply cannot find work or have reduced work hours than ever before. Many come in to apply for financial assistance for the very first time.

In 2021, FACES assisted 110% above what they normally assist; most of which were first time Clients. In the beginning of 2021, some clients were starting off the year with high utility bill balances that were not exempt from the moratorium for protection, so these clients fell through this crack in the system. Many people were also told that they did not qualify for assistance, even though they were qualified. Nevertheless, they were responsible for their bills until they were able to prove their qualification. In addition to this problem, there were issues with the Government Assistance program for rental and utility assistance, problems figuring out how to disperse the funds, and a computer glitch that prevented payments. The result is a long backlog in government assistance coming through, and some of these folks continue to struggle today as they are waiting for the backlog to clear.

FACES is solely supported by donations from area churches, businesses, and individuals and the dedication of many community volunteers. They assist more families than ever, and because of the problems people, and businesses who generally support us are facing due to the pandemic, FACES is looking at reduced funding. This has prompted creative ways to raise funds, one of which is the Mardi Gras Celebration planned for March 1st. (It is a masquerade party) Please join FACES at the Cleveland Draft house in

Fuquay for a fun time.

Tickets for the event are available from Board Members (Me, Donna Wooten!) for \$12.50 each which covers the cost of finger foods, deserts, and refreshments. The fundraiser part is a silent auction of donated items valued anywhere from \$10 to \$1000. So come join with FACES, have a fun evening, and bid on some of our auction items. I am sure we have something that will appeal to everyone. You may get a bargain; FACES will hopefully make some money; and a few more families may be able to keep their lights on next month.

Thank you to all of the Trinity family members who support FACES, and I hope to see you behind that Mardi Gras mask on March 1st.

Experienced Altar Guild members are ready to mentor one and all.



Sonnet Sequence with Todd Truffin

"All the kingdoms of the world" by Malcolm Guite (2012)

'So here's the deal and this is what you get:
The penthouse suite with world-commanding views,
The banker's bonus and the private jet,
Control and ownership of all the news,
An "in" to that exclusive one percent,
Who know the score, who really run the show,
With interest on every penny lent
And sweeteners for cronies in the know.
A straight arrangement between me and you,
No hell below or heaven high above,
You just admit it, and give me my due
And wake up from this foolish dream of love...'
But Jesus laughed, 'You are not what you seem.
Love is the waking life, you are the dream.'



Anglican poet-priest Malcolm Guite demonstrates the power of the closing two lines of a Shakespearean sonnet in this poem about the third temptation of Christ in the desert. As we enter into Lent, we might consider how power tempts us. The temptation is not just about personal comfort; imagine all the good you could do in the world if you had just influence in the right places. Guite allows the tempter 12 full lines to make his offer, to outline all the enticements that he offers.

In the Gospel of Matthew, the devil offers Jesus the world if only he will "fall down and worship me" (4:9). Guite translates this as a denunciation of love. If God is love (1 John 4:7-8), then worshiping the devil is a turning away from love. And it is at the end of his offer that the foolish devil overplays his hand. At the instant the devil tells him that love is a dream, Jesus, Son of Love, takes over. In the stinging retort that the couplet of a Shakespearean sonnet is known for, Jesus reminds the devil that it is love that gives life abundantly (John 10:10). May this Lent help us to identify false promises of earthly power and wake to love.
